Annotation

It is also in the interest of NATO and Hungary, as a member state, to have states around us that are characterized by a democratic system, a market economy, economic prosperity, the rule of law and stability, and the range of states that carry the possibility of a crisis or a threat to security in a certain area should extend further and further from our borders.

Despite its sometimes contradictory behavior, Ukraine has taken significant steps to strengthen security: it has got rid of nuclear weapons, acceded to the Convention on the Non-Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction, acceded to the Open Skies Convention, settled relations with neighboring states on territorial issues and minority policies, participates in the Partnership for Peace and has participated (takes part in) peacekeeping missions. The study is also intended to explore the area of NATO-Ukraine cooperation, but also the issue of Euro-Atlantic integration.

As a major milestone in NATO-Ukraine co-operation, as agreed by the NATO-Ukraine Commission (NUC), the two sides considered it necessary to deepen and broaden co-operation, and a NATO Ukrainian Action Plan. The Action Plan contains jointly agreed principles and items. Annual Target Plans (ATPs) will be developed to support compliance and implementation, which will include specific measures defining the tasks of the Ukrainian side or NATO-Ukraine joint actions.
