

Data protection information on personal data processed by the Geopolitical Council Public Benefit Foundation about the Foundation's sponsors

The purpose of this policy below is to help you, as a sponsor to the Geopolitical Council's Public Benefit Foundation, obtain all important information regarding the Foundation's processing of your personal data. We process personal data about you. The management of your personal data is based on the protection of individuals with regard to the protection of processing the personal data and on the free movement of such data and Regulation No 2016/679/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 April 2016 repealing Regulation No 95/46/EK (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter "GDPR"), and Act CXII of 2011 (Infotv) on the right to information self-determination and freedom of information.

What do we treat and why?

From your personal data, your name, bank account number, email address and, if you have requested a tax certificate, your tax identification number and address as your data relating to your donation to the Foundation. The purpose of data management is to enable the Geopolitical Council Public Benefit Foundation to comply with its statutory record-keeping and reporting obligations regarding its revenues and to maintain regular contact with the sponsor. The legal basis for data management is that the Foundation can fulfill its existing legal obligation (Article 6 (1) (c) GDPR.) and the sponsor's consent (Article 6 (1) (a) of the GDPR).

Who has access to your data?

With regard to each of the recorded data, the data controller is the Geopolitical Council Public Benefit Foundation (headquarters: 1036 Budapest, Kiskorona utca 14. VI / 31 .; registry court: Metropolitan Court; independently represented by: Dr. István Pintér, Chairman of the Board of Trustees; contact e-mail: research @ cgeopol.hu, contact telephone number: +3620 3687810). The managed data can be obtained by the President of the Foundation, his financial officer and his current accountant, and in case of official control by the employees of the authorities. The names of the sponsors (individuals, legal entities and non-legal entities) are published by the Foundation on its website as a general rule. A written statement against this may be made in advance or afterwards, which the Foundation shall comply with within 10 working days. Other data may not be disclosed in any form to anyone without your express prior consent.

What organizational and security measures do we take to protect your data?

The Foundation manages your personal data in a password-protected document on the server of Magyar Telekom Plc. And Samuel F. B. Morse Ltd., and does not make this data available in other IT systems.

How long do we process your data?

The Foundation manages the data related to its donation until the end of the seventh year following its donation, until the tax expiration.

Can you request the deletion, correction or restriction of data processing?

You may request the deletion of data relating to your donation and contact details if you consider that the processing is unlawful, no longer necessary for the purposes for which it was processed, or in accordance with EU or national law it should be deleted on the basis of an obligation. Of course, in case of incorrect data recording or a change in your data, you can request the correction of the processed data.

How can you access information about your personal information?

You may request information from the Foundation as to which personal data we process for what purpose and in what manner, and may request a copy of the personal data we process. We will fulfill these requests free of charge. In order to protect your data, we can only grant your rights of disposal and access after prior identification. Therefore, we ask you to report your requests, statements and complaints related to data management in writing, or if this would not be possible for any reason, to call the head of the organization at 06-20-368-78-10. In the latter case, proof of identity will be required to exercise your rights.

In addition, you may file an action with the Metropolitan Court (1055 Budapest, Markó u. 27. Mailing address: 1363 Bp. Pf. 16.) or with the court competent according to your place of residence for the unlawful handling of your personal data or the violation of your rights to information self-determination, or to the National Data Protection and Freedom of Information Authority (1135 Budapest, Szilágyi Erzsébet fasor 22 / C., www.naih.hu).
